Letter from the President

Dear Friends of Private and Independent Education:

We hope you had a restful and rewarding holiday and New Year break. This month's communication is full of important updates, training opportunities and details on the latest COVID relief bill passed by Congress.

The most significant item is **The Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021 (CRRSA Act)**, signed into law on December 27, 2020, authorized the **Emergency Assistance to Non-Public Schools (EANS) program**, which is part of the Act's Governor's Emergency Education Relief (GEER) Fund. The EANS program is designed to address the impact that the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) has had, and continues to have, on non-public school students and teachers. The CRRSA Act provides \$2.75 billion for the EANS program. **Minnesota's EANS portion is \$41.9 million.**

Under the EANS program, the Department awards grants by formula to each Governor with an approved Certification and Agreement to provide services or assistance to eligible non-public schools. By accepting an EANS award from the Department, a Governor designates the State educational agency (SEA) to administer the program. To receive services or assistance, an eligible non-public school must submit an application to the SEA. Because the CRRSA Act established a separate program for which eligible non-public schools may apply to an SEA to receive services or assistance, a local educational agency (LEA) is not required to provide equitable services to students and teachers in non-public schools from supplemental funds received under the CRRSA Act's Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER II Fund) or GEER Fund (GEER II Fund). However, equitable services requirements continue to apply under the CARES Act's ESSER and GEER programs.

In a perfect world, all the necessary details and answers to the myriad questions schools will have would be available. Unfortunately, the scale of these programs is immense and FAQs and guidance always takes longer than expected. The change in administration at the federal level, and USDE, could create additional uncertainty on this process. Rest assured, MISF will provide pertinent details as they become available.

Our national organization, Council for American Private Education (CAPE), has an exceptional summary on the new legislation; we have included a link below. This includes information on the second round of the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) eligibility.

MISF, in partnership with other organizations and advocates for nonpublic education, remains in frequent communication with the MN Department of Education and elected officials to ensure the voice of nonpublic students and schools is heard.
