



STEM Grant Program

"It has been amazing to watch students rise to new challenges, approach unfamiliar tasks, and problem solve through obstacles because of the new materials and tools that are available to our students through the MINNDEPENDENT Innovation Grant. Middle school students independently

using drills, a table saw, and the band saw. Elementary students are exploring and creating with new materials including snap circuits and LEGOS. High school students have learned how to use Solid Works and have produced parts on our CNC milling machine.
